Providing Warm Healthy Meals



Herndon United Methodist Men cooked and delivered breakfast for dinner at the local hypothermia shelter on February 13. This meal of scrambled eggs, turkey sausage, bacon, hash browns, fruit, juices, and snacks is part of Herndon UMC's support of the North County Hypothermia Prevention Program operated by Cornerstones and Fairfax County.

The men enjoy supporting this mission as a team and have made it an annual activity. Thank you to Jim Henderson, Tim Knotts, Fred Kibler, Page Duppstadt, Jon Simons, and Jeff Hagstrom for helping provide meals to those who needed it most on a cold, February night.

Hypothermia Dinners run December through March each year, and Herndon UMC has already started reserving dates for next year.

As we enter into March, we are entering not only into a new month, but a new season in the life of our church — the season of Lent. Our call is to see what God is doing and follow where God is leading.

safe and healthy home repairs. Rebuilding Together provides these repairs at zero cost to the residents, who are often faced with diminishing resources and must choose food and medicine over critical home repairs.




